MINISTER'S MESSAGE

To be the church, we need to do five things well: worship, fellowship, teaching, outreach, and proclamation. Our congregation's mission statement reflects these five ministries. In 2022 our revised Constitution embedded these core ministries in our governance structure.

How do we strengthen and grow Strathroy United Church? We gather on Sundays (worship ministry), care for one another (fellowship ministry), teach and learn the faith (teaching ministry), serve our community (outreach), and talk about God's good news publicly (proclamation ministry). That's what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. That's what it means to be a mature member of Strathroy United Church.

How do we grow personally as disciples of Christ? Ask yourself these questions. Did I worship God this week? Did I spend fellowship time with someone in the congregation this week? Did I study or teach the faith this week? Did I give my time, talents, or treasure to someone in need this week? Did I tell someone about my faith this week?

This annual report describes our collective work to animate these five core ministries. Let's celebrate our accomplishments and not be naïve about our challenges. But let's not be distracted by symptoms -- revenue, expenditures, attendance, volunteers. Let's keep focused on sources of congregational flourishing, especially our five core ministries.

In 2022 we resumed weekly Children's Worship (teaching ministry), and now we're seeing more children on Sunday mornings (worship ministry). We resumed some regular groups and experimented with new groups (fellowship ministry). We supported Bub'z soup kitchen and Coldest Night of the Year (outreach ministry). We organized a public Christmas carol hymn sing out in the community (proclamation ministry). Thank you to Community Life and Congregational Life Teams for activating these ministries.

In 2022 our governance and support ministries reinforced our core ministries. Our Property Team beautified our sanctuary, maintained, and repaired our building. Our Finance Team and Trustees stewarded our investments. Our Ministry and Personnel Team hired a new Office Administrator. Our Council broke new records in meeting efficiency and effectiveness. Collectively, we learned (and are learning) to use Microsoft Teams to organize our communication.

In 2022 we thanked Patti Baratta for three excellent years as Office Administrator. We welcomed Karen Pritchard to our ministry team with Andy Cloutier, Joe Rychel, Tim McMillan, and Kaeleigh Berdan. I am blessed to serve this congregation with these teammates. We are blessed as a congregation to serve Strathroy-Caradoc and the larger world.

CHAIR OF CHURCH COUNCIL

The year 2022 was progressive in transitioning back to a more normal environment after facing restrictions during the past couple of years. Attendance is gaining traction as it's supported on the volunteerism and encouragement of many church members.

The reopen team that was in place during the pandemic wasn't required to be as active as they were during the closings and health requirements established by the Province and local jurisdiction. We have, however, continued with various hygiene efforts including daily sanitizing and disinfecting efforts by Joe and those utilizing the church facilities.

A Constitution, as required by the United Church of Canada, was reviewed at length, discussed, completed and forwarded to Regional. Our vision statement remains the same. Consistent with Provincial Law, the accessibility for persons with disability policy, will be reviewed and updated as needed, through a channel on Teams. Based on the age of the church, and resources already in place, we don't require any changes at this time.

The children's worship time, 'Children's Time' became an integral part of the Sunday morning services and supported by the member volunteer teachers. The interactive message to children from Rev. Brad precedes, and is linked to, the sermon that follows. This has been well received as is the encouraging church growth of several new members. It's good to see the smiling young faces at the front of the church each Sunday morning.

Regular Communion dates returned to the Sanctuary with pre-packaged bread and wine elements provided and available for distribution prior to the service.

The offerings remain centralized with offering plates at the entrances to the Sanctuary in which to accept individual offerings as opposed to passing the offering plate along the isles.

The Rusty Wrench was again host to an enthusiastic evening of karaoke style 'beer and Christmas Carols' at their business on Front Street. The socialization and music were enjoyed by all.

In preparation for Christmas, a very lovely well decorated Sanctuary met the crowd that attended the beautiful Christmas Eve service.

- **General Fund**: Overall revenue, including envelope donations and fundraising, is down due to the pandemic. However, the revenue was close to what was budgeted due to the receipt of the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS). Total expenses are \$234,036 for a deficit of \$96,695. This deficit was reduced to \$58,509, partly due to the final instalment received from the Estate of Margaret Goldthorp.
- Mission and Service Fund: Strathroy United Church remitted \$15,000 to the United Church of Canada for the 2021 pledge. An additional \$1,380 was sent to assist with emergency relief in Haiti.
- **Solar Panels:** The remaining balance is \$4,232.86. The balance will be paid in 2022 and revenue will be directed to the General Fund.
- Additional Comments: It is largely due to bequests that the church continues to
 operate as they cover the deficit. Many thanks to Patti Baratta, Patti Krista, Dianne
 Dixon, James Blackmore, and Kevin O'Brien for their support and assistance.

All staff provided flexibility as was required given the restrictions and protocols that were continually changing on what seemed a regular basis.

Leading our Ministry team is Rev Brad Morrison. Brad provides excellent leadership skills in both his ministry and with the staff. During regular worship services Brad shares relevant and meaningful messages, just as we heard today. Brad has continued to work at improving the livestream worship that became necessary when could not hold in person services and is also now offered for those unable to attend regular Sunday services. He has been very creative with his Children's Time with messages at times being shared while on a bike (or even a tricycle) which have been enjoyed by everyone. Brad has also organized a new member gathering and continues to preside at weddings and funerals as well as providing nursing home services. Brad generously agreed to support a practicum student minister for several months who will greatly benefit from the sharing of his vast knowledge and many strengths. Brad was an integral part of the Reopening Team and we appreciate his dedication to assuring that the church re-opened in a safe and timely manner.

Patti Baratta, Office Administrator, oversees the day-to-day operation of the church and assists Rev. Brad as needed, ensuring all administrative duties are performed as required. Throughout the year, Patti had the ability to alternate between the office and home when needed which ensured that she was able to continue her work regardless of the restrictions that were in place. Patti does an excellent job of overseeing the scheduling of rentals and events, her organized and efficient manner and willingness to help where needed does not go unnoticed.

Providing his ministry through music, Andy Cloutier is our Music Director. Andy has continued to share his many musical talents throughout the year and now, with some of the

protocols being lifted, we have seen the return of some of the choir members and have also enjoyed the guest musicians that Andy has arranged and who are always a welcome addition to the service. Andy's gift of music is an important part of Sunday worship services.

Joe Rychel just completed his first year as custodian for the church building, his many skills that he brought with him have proven to be very beneficial. During the time where the church building was closed, Joe continued to work on the maintenance of the building along with several projects that needed to be done. Joe continues to ensure all health and safety protocols related to COVID are followed and does an excellent job at taking care of our church building for the enjoyment of all.

Treasurer Tim McMillan looks after the financial aspects of our church and records all financial transactions, providing detailed reports on a monthly basis with great attention to detail, making them easy to understand. Tim works closely with the Finance Team and, as always, is diligent in ensuring all necessary documentation and reporting is done in a timely manner and is able to provide a concise report when required to the Council.

Our Child and Youth Leader, Kaeleigh Berdan, works with the youth of our congregation and the community. Due to the ever-changing protocols that were in place during the last year, Kaleigh needed to be flexible with her plans. When able to, Kaleigh arranged for such events as an Ice Cream Fun Night, Halloween Themed get together, and a night spent together around a bonfire. We appreciate Kaleigh's creativity and energy as she works with our youth.

We have had the pleasure of having Tabitha McLachlin Carey with us over the past several months for her practicum while working on her Masters of Divinity at Atlantic School of Theology. Tabitha regularly takes part in the Sunday services with the Children's Time or sermons which are enjoyed by the congregation. We wish Tabitha the best of luck in her continued studies.

Thank you to each and every one of our staff. While the year continued to be one of many challenges, due to the dedicated staff working together we pulled through and it is the hope that the year ahead will allow us to return to more normalcy and complete the work of the church that we are meant to do while keeping each one of us safe.

CELEBRATIONS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In 2022 we welcomed Nancy Larocque as a Trustee. The Trustees met in September in person to discuss insurance, and other business was dealt with by email:

- The Trustees are required to sign off approval for any "Bequest Form Requests", and we gave approval to the \$20k sanctuary carpet replacement property.
- The Trustees also receive any notices from the municipality on neighbourhood land use changes, and we monitored the proposed severance of a parcel of land from a North Street neighbour, concluding the matter did not affect our congregation.
- We obtained a copy of the congregation's property deed from our lawyer to keep secure in the office safe.

Our congregation's insurance coverage was renewed with HUB International UCC Protect through Kettlewell Insurance. Total coverage limit is \$5,387,258 with a renewal premium at \$13,455.00. The premium increase is \$2,046.96, which is significant and experienced across the sector. The Trustees are monitoring the plans by General Council to offer its own insurance coverage plan to congregations.

The Trustees oversee the Investment Team, which oversees the congregation's investment portfolio according to the investment policy. The Investment Team includes representation from Trustees and Finance. Investment reports are included with other financial reports in this annual report.

CELEBRATIONS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Community Life Team's mission is to be the leaders who create care, outreach, and proclamation ministry opportunities for the congregation to be on mission for God.

Tina Zimmermann retired as team chair in 2022, and we thank her for leading this ministry. We welcomed Wanda Dickey and Nancy Larocque to the team in 2022. Cathy Adkin and Brenda Bourdeau transferred meal ministries leadership to Denise Johnson. Our team shifted most operations to Microsoft Teams, where our various project and ministry leads could consult without unnecessary in-person business meetings.

We reorganized our team's projects (and related budgets) to reflect the revised Constitution's emphasis on five core ministries. Community Life Team is responsible for three core ministries:

- Congregational Care Ministries: summer campfire, celebrations, social events, groups, local transportation, and membership (historic roll)
- Outreach Ministries: meal ministries, kitchen expenses, compassionate fund, Mission & Service Fund, and other special appeals (e.g., foodbank, Bub'z, WRRC)
- Proclamation Ministries: evangelism and promotion (e.g., communications, , fundraising meals (e.g., roast beef dinner, Christmas bake sale)

Other 2022 highlights include:

- being the top fundraising team for the 2022 Coldest Night of the Year campaign
- a successful summer campfire and BBQ on the Front Street lawn
- establishing an account with Ricco Foods for supporting Bub'z soup kitchen operations
- starting (and restarting) small group ministries, including a women's discussion and support group, Parlour Group, and Friendship Club
- providing meal support to homeless people through 37 Frank Youth Centre
- Beer & Carols at Rusty Wrench
- increasing online engagement (clicks, likes, members) with our Facebook pages by creating and curating social media content.

CELEBRATIONS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

As the new year dawned, our church faced renewed covid restrictions with the spreading of the Omicron wave in our community. Once again, our congregation adapted our worship practices to these constraints. In time we were able to return to the so-called 'new normal'. The Congregational Life team is focused on the worship and teaching ministries within Strathroy United Church and in this regard, there were a number of notable celebrations and accomplishments:

- We continue to welcome new members by transfer and by proclamation of faith.
- Our support of a student practicum position was of mutual benefit to the student, Tabitha
 Carey, and the congregation. Tabitha started with us in mid-2021 and in May we bid adieu to
 her as she completed her practicum and continued her studies.
- Rev Brad continues to lead a vibrant weekly bible study group.
- Communion was celebrated on six occasions during the year.
- The congregation received a donation of a very attractive Christ candle and wooden candle stand. This donation was made by the Lambert family.
- The children's worship program underwent a successful 'reboot' in September. The program was organized by Rev Brad and is delivered by an enthusiastic team of volunteers.
- Early in the year, Microsoft Teams was introduced to Strathroy United. The Congregational Life team, like other teams, went through the onboarding process to better understand its uses and functionality. The benefits of this collaborative tool are becoming more apparent as time goes by.
- Rev Brad continues to introduce variations and innovations to our weekly worship service. For example, Brad interviewed Melissa Vukovich on hosting Ukrainian refugees and Don Langford retelling information from one of mission trips.

I would like to thank each of the members of the Congregational Life team and the ad hoc team leaders for their commitment to achieving our goals. I would also like to acknowledge the strong and steady leadership that Rev Brad brings to the table as we endeavor to deliver meaningful worship and teaching ministries.

CHALLENGES

As noted in some prior years the issue of Children's Worship is an on-going challenge. It is generally recognized that vibrant Children's Worship and Youth programs are essential to the long-term future of our church. I feel that a very significant step in this direction has been made with this year's reboot of Children's Worship and the continued collaboration with 37 Frank Youth Centre. CELEBRATIONS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. The Pastoral Display Case adjacent to the Sanctuary was duplicated with new construction by John Austen.
- 2. Storage areas and rooms throughout the church were cleaned and organized with redundant materials removed and discarded.
- 3. 2021 boiler repairs and a new Service provider, with discounts, substantially reduced boiler repairs and costs in 2022.
- 4. The Sanctuary flooring with an underlay of mahogany plywood and new carpeting was installed following the repainting and plastering of this area in 2021.
- 5. The Wi-Fi for Stepping Stones was up-graded with satisfactory results and no further concerns.
- 6. The battery that supports the fire alarm system was tested by London Fire and requires replacement. Approval was done in the fall of 2022 however parts are still on back-order.
- 7. The Sanctuary fans were lowered and cleaned. The lighting was all replaced with LED bulbs.
- 8. An agreement was reached with the YMCA for a supervised summer camp mostly in the GJR.
- 9. Landscaping clean-up and shrubs trimming on the south & west sides of the church.
- 10. Thanks to Joe, the kitchen received a new coat of paint.

CHALLENGES

With a Restricted and Unrestricted Bequest Fund approval for \$35,000 a complete retrofit of the Lift Elevator has been arranged subject to congregational approval in March. Ensuring work completion and license inspection, with minimal disruption to Stepping Stones and church activities, will be required.

A substantial late 2023 project or spring/ summer of 2024 is currently being investigated. Several of the concrete caps on the external brick pillars are in serious need of replacement in order to protect the pillars from further wear and tear. The committee is checking for those pillars with the most pressing need for replacement and the best sources of workmanship to complete this job.

We monitor income and expenses and report these figures to the Church Council on a monthly basis. It is also the responsibility of the Finance Team to keep the congregation informed of financial matters on a regular basis.

The Chair of Finance also sits on the Investment Committee, meeting with members of the Trustees as well as our account representatives from BMO Nesbitt Burns.

The Finance Team would like to thank each and every member of the Strathroy United Church congregation for your support with your time, talent, commitment, and offerings during these uncertain times. This past year envelope donations stabilized and there was a slight increase of \$665 from 2021. We pray that 2023 continues to bring a positive increase to our donations. Despite the slight increase in overall envelope donations, total church revenue declined in 2022 primarily due to the reduction in investment interest and the elimination of the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy program. Expenses for the church were well controlled and decreased slightly from 2021. Despite the decline in expenses, Strathroy United Church continues to operate at a sizeable deficit. The 2022 shortfall after transferring the Unrestricted Bequest Fund Interest and Realized Investment Gain to Operations is \$111,857.

The role of the Investment Committee is to oversee the investments of Strathroy United Church by ensuring that our funds are invested within the guidelines set out by the Investment Policy, to review the performance of our portfolio and to review and confirm the investment strategy.

As of December 31, 2022 the church's total long term investment portfolio is healthy and as per the Financial statements totals \$1,958,252. This is slightly higher than the December 31, 2021 year end balance of \$1,956,800. Included in this balance is over \$216,000 in unrealized gains in Frontier Capital Funds. Due to the fluctuation in markets this balance is slightly down from 2022.

In 2022 the Investment Team met with the new BMO Nesbitt Burn representative in September to discuss our account. We will be arranging further meetings in 2023 with both Frontier and BMO to further discuss our investments.

4 Solar Panels

In 2011 the church started and completed the installation of solar panels on the church roof.

The electricity generated by these panels is being sold to the local power authority. The cost of the supply and the installation has been financed through the use of bequest funds. Proceeds from the sale of the electricity is being used to reimburse the Bequest fund. In August of 2022 the total proceeds to date surpassed the cost of the solar panel installation and any proceeds from that point on have been recorded General Fund operating revenue.

To date, the following amounts have been transferred from the General Fund to the Bequest Fund. These amounts represent the power produced in each year:

5 Church Mission Fund Applied to Meal Ministry Expenses

In 2022 the amount of donations to the Church Mission Fund totalled \$1,110.00. Per council's approval, \$1,069.00 of this amount was allocated to offset the \$1,069.00 Meal Ministry Expenses.

6 Christmas Eve Loose Offering

The 2022 Christmas Eve Loose Offering totalled \$115.00. Per council's approval, 50% of this amount will be donated to the Women's Rural Resource Centre and 50% will be donated to Bub'z Drop In & Soup Kitchen.

7 RBC Shares and Other Equity Funds

In December 2015 the church received a donation of RBC Shares with a market value of \$10,191.95 on the date of the donation and in December 2020 a donation of Equity Funds was received with a market value of \$24,860.31 at the date of donation. As a result of daily fluctuations in the market value

of these shares and funds, unrealized gains and losses need to be recognized in the financial statements. These gains/losses are recorded as increases/decreases in the Equity section of the balance sheet.

8 Frontier Capital

- a) The growth component of the investment portfolio is intended to capture higher returns than the guaranteed income component and therefore has a long term time horizon and it includes some equity investments. The market value of the growth component will not exceed 50% of the market value of the total investment portfolio, with no more than 25% of the market value invested in Principal Protected Notes (PPN). These investments are held by Frontier Capital Funds in a balanced mutual fund and by BMO Nesbitt Burns in shares and mutual funds.
- **b)** Unrealized gains and losses for the Frontier Capital investments, the RBC shares and the BMO Nesbitt Burns equity investments are recorded as increases or decreases in the appropriate Equity section of the balance sheet.
